Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University adheres to the principle of equal education and employment opportunity without regard to race, handicap, sex, age, color, creed, or national origin. This policy extends to all programs and activities involving or supported by the university.

The University Veterans' Affairs Office (UVAO) serves over 4000 veterans, service persons and their dependents annually. This office is fully staffed with qualified counselors who provide services such as personal counseling; assistance in resolving problems that may arise in the student's relations with the University and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (U.S. DVA); provides general and specific information about all benefits available to men and women who served in the armed forces; job placement on and off campus; reporting enrollment information to authorize appropriate allowances; and provides other advisory counseling and referral services.

The purpose of this handbook is to provide information on topics we think you should be aware of. Failure to adhere to the information contained in this handbook may result in delays of certification, inaccurate reporting of training time, overpayment, and unnecessary termination of education benefits. We welcome you to contact either the UVAO or ERAU campus at your convenience.

APPLICATION FOR VETERANS EDUCATION BENEFITS

VA applications are designed to obtain the data necessary to determine eligibility for educational assistance benefits for particular educational objectives. The application and required forms vary according to the type of benefits and to the circumstances. Refer to the matrix on pages 8-12 to determine which forms apply. Students should apply online using the **Veterans On-Line Application**: www.vabenefits.vba.va.gov/vonapp.

VONAPP forms will be transmitted directly to the Dept. of Veterans Affairs (DVA) Regional Processing Office (RPO) with jurisdiction for the student's education/training institution, as provided by the student. Print a copy of the application for your records. Students will receive an automated e-mail notice, which will identify the VA office that received and downloaded the application. **Worldwide Online (AASA) students should submit the application to the Southern Region (Atlanta RPO).**

CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY (COE)

Once the DVA has received the application and all necessary supporting documents, the claim will be processed and a file number established (usually the Social Security number). Veterans, service persons, and eligible dependents will receive notification of this action in the form of a Certificate of Eligibility. Chapter 33 COE will provide the level of eligibility percentage. Be sure to provide a copy to the VA Certifying Official (CO) at your ERAU location.

Worldwide Online (AASA) should scan and email a copy to the UVAO at dbvetaff@erau.edu.

ENROLLMENT CERTIFICATION

Students must request that the campus certify their enrollment to the DVA.

Worldwide Online (AASA)

All enrollment certifications for students attending ERAU through Worldwide Online are completed by the University Veterans' Affairs Office (UVAO). Students must complete and submit an Enrollment Certification Request Form (ECR-WO-08-09) by email or fax to the UVAO for each period of enrollment that s/he would like to be certified. Contact the UVAO at dbvetaff@erau.edu or obtain the form on the UVAO website:

www.erau.edu/er/veterans/index.html.

The ERAU VA Certifying Officials use an online certification of enrollment (VA-ONCE) to report all pertinent information concerning enrollment to the DVA. This reduces the manual time needed to prepare forms, eliminates mail time, and provides immediate receipt by the DVA. It takes approximately six to eight weeks for the DVA to process initial enrollment claims and approximately 30 days to process continuing claims.

STUDENT VERIFICATION OF ENROLLMENT

Students receiving Montgomery G.I. Bill, Chapter 30, 1606 or 1607 (REAP) education benefits must verify enrollment monthly to the Department of Veterans Affairs in order to receive payment. Benefits are paid after each month of school is completed. Verification should be done beginning the last day of the month by using Web Automated Verification of Enrollment system (WAVE) <http://www.gibill.va.gov/resources/verify-attendance/> or by calling toll free **1-877-823-2378**. Both of these services are available 7 days a week, 24 hours a day.

Students must be currently enrolled in some form of approved educational program and have a current or active benefit award in the VA system. If these conditions are not met there will not be a record in the WAVE system.

POST 9/11 (CHAPTER 33)

Post 9/11 - Chapter 33 Certificate Of Eligibility (COE) must be submitted to your ERAU locations' VA Certifying Official for proof of level of eligibility.

Level of Eligibility Chart

Monthly Housing Allowance: the monthly housing allowance is based on the monthly basic allowance for housing (BAH) payable for a military member with dependents in pay grade **E-5** residing **in the same ZIP code for the college or university where the individual is enrolled**. Active duty members, individuals training at **50% pursuit or less**, and individuals pursuing **only** distance learning are **not** eligible for a housing stipend. The full BAH is payable for **all** pursuit that is **more than 50%** of full time pursuit, e.g., where 12 semester hours would be full time, the full BAH would be payable for all pursuit of **more than 6** semester hours. Book Stipend: individuals may receive a stipend for up to \$1,000 a year for books. The individual will receive a lump sum payment in the first month of each quarter, semester, or term at the rate of \$41.67 per credit hour up to a yearly total of 24 credits. **NOTE:** The amount of the monthly housing allowance and the book stipend must be prorated based on the percentage of maximum benefit payable as noted in the above chart.

The Yellow Ribbon Program: was enacted to assist eligible individuals with payment of tuition and fees where costs exceed the most expensive in-state undergraduate tuition at a public institution. To be eligible, the student must be: a veteran receiving benefits at the 100% rate payable, a transfer of entitlement dependent child/spouse of a veteran. VA will match the school's percentage (up to 50%) to reduce or eliminate out-of-pocket cost. Student would be eligible if:

- Served an aggregate period of active duty after Sept. 10, 2001, of at least 36 months.
- Honorably discharged from active duty for a service connected disability and you served 30 continuous days after Sept. 10, 2001;
- A dependent eligible for Transfer of Entitlement (TOE) under the Post 9/11 GI Bill based on a veteran's service.

Transfer of Entitlement (TOE) Under Chapter 33: the Department of Defense (DoD) is authorized to allow individuals who, on or after August 1, 2009, have served at least 6 years in the Armed Forces and who agree to serve at least 4 more years in the Armed Forces to transfer unused entitlement to their dependents (spouse, children). The Department of Defense may, by regulation, impose additional eligibility requirements and limit the number of months transferable to not less than 18 months.

VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION & EMPLOYMENT - Chapter. 31

A veteran may be eligible for Chapter 31 benefits if he or she:

- Received or will receive, a discharge under other than dishonorable conditions;
- incurred or aggravated a service-connected disability on or after September 16, 1940, which entitles them to DVA disability compensation; and
- is in need of vocational rehabilitation because his or her disability creates an employment handicap.

Entitlement for these services is determined on an individual basis following an evaluation of the veteran's unique interests, aptitudes, education, work experience, and vocational abilities. Voc Rehab may be provided for up to 48 months. An eligible veteran generally has 12 years from the date he/she is notified of entitlement to DVA compensation in which to use these benefits. The DVA may approve an extension of time and/or length of training in certain cases.

Contact your State DVA office at 1-800-827-1000 for more information and to request *Form 28-1900, Disabled Veterans' Application for Vocational Rehabilitation*.

DIRECT DEPOSIT

The DVA encourages the use of direct deposit. This is the safest and fastest way to receive VA education benefits. Direct deposit may be initiated by calling 1-877-838-2778 or by submitting a written request to the DVA Regional Processing Office with jurisdiction for the ERAU campus you are attending. Be sure to provide the financial institution's routing number, account number, and type of account (checking or savings).

INTERVAL (BREAK) PAY

The DVA may pay educational assistance continuously during the intervals between certified terms.

DVA **authorizes** breaks that do not exceed eight weeks and when the terms before and after the breaks are not shorter than the break.

DVA will **not authorize** interval payment in the following instances:

- (1) An interval between terms if the student is attending **less than ½ time or is on active duty.**
- (2) A student **transfers from one school to another without** a change of program and the interval that exceeds 30 days but is less than a full calendar month.
- (3) An interval, regardless of length, preceding **a change of program when the student also changes institutions.**
- (4) An interval which is specifically designated by an institution as an interval between the end of one academic or school year and the beginning of the next, if the institution operates on **other than** a term, quarter, or semester basis.
- (5) A student, prior to authorization of payments or prior to check negotiation, **requests that no benefits be paid for the interval.**
- (6) An interval during which a student's **entitlement will be exhausted** and it is to the student's advantage not to receive benefits for the interval.
- (7) An interval following the student's withdrawal from all courses in the preceding term.

TUTORIAL ASSISTANCE

Tutorial assistance may be paid to eligible veterans enrolled at least half time and receiving benefits under Ch. 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 1606 & 1607. Tutorial assistance aids the student in defraying tutorial expenses and will be paid to reimburse reasonable charges by a tutor. To qualify, the student must have a deficiency in a subject making tutoring necessary. The maximum amount payable is \$100 a month with a maximum benefit of \$1200. A charge to entitlement will be made for assistance received in excess of \$600 by Ch. 30, 32, 33, 1606 and 1607. Students enrolled under Ch. 31 should consult their VR&E Case Manager regarding this assistance.

DVA WORK STUDY PROGRAM

Veterans and Reservists enrolled $\frac{3}{4}$ time or more and training under Chapters 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 1606, 1607 and Section 903 may be eligible for employment on a part-time basis. The DVA will pay a non-taxable allowance equal to the prevailing Federal or State minimum wage, whichever is higher.

Work study services may be performed at VA regional offices, educational institution, VA medical facilities, VA national cemeteries, and certain other organizations approved for outreach activities. For Chapter 1606 & 1607 trainees only, services may be performed at DoD National Guard and Coast Guard facilities, and administration of Chapter 1606 & 1607 program.

CHANGES IN STUDENT STATUS

All students receiving VA education benefits are required to inform the school certifying official of **ALL** of the following changes:

- Periods of enrollment
- Audits and withdrawals
- Change of degree programs including minors and natural progression from Bachelors to Masters
- Catalog changes
- Address change
- Change in dependents applicable to those eligible for CH 34/30
- Course substitutions (approval must be obtained prior to enrolling in course)
- Intra-University Transfer
- Supplemental Enrollments
- Repeating Courses

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

All students receiving DVA education benefits are required to maintain satisfactory academic progress according to published standards established and enforced by the university. Embry-Riddle's Standards of Progress have been approved by the appropriate State Approving Agencies (SAA) and accepted by the DVA.

Title 38, United States Code, Sections 3474 and 3524 requires that education assistance benefits to veterans and other eligible persons be discontinued when the student ceases to make satisfactory progress towards completion of his or her training objective. Accordingly, benefits will be interrupted for:

- **undergraduate students** who remain on academic probation for 2 consecutive periods of 12 credit hours.
- **graduate students** who are subject to dismissal.

The ERAU campus/UVAO will discontinue certification and will inform the DVA of this action. The DVA determines whether or not payments will be terminated and the conditions for reinstatement of benefits. Students have a right to appeal.

AUDITS, WITHDRAWALS, NON-REQUIRED COURSES, & REPEATS

The VA will not authorize payment for:

- withdrawals/drops
- audits
- courses that are not applicable to a declared degree objective
- courses for which a grade assigned is not used in computing requirement for graduation.
- repeating a course for which a grade of "D" or better (unless a higher grade is required).

Note: Payment will be authorized for repeated required courses for which a failing grade was received.

DOUBLE MAJORS, DUAL DEGREES, AND MINORS

Effective 6/12/2009 - Enrollment in dual majors at an Institution of Higher Learning (IHL) are no longer required to obtain approval from the Dept. of VA State Approving Agency as long as both majors are approved programs offered by the IHL and they relate to the same career field.

REMEDIAL, DEFICIENCY & REFRESHER

Remedial and Deficiency courses are typically intended to assist individuals in overcoming weaknesses in particular areas of study at the secondary school level. Often, institutions will require the completion of certain deficiency courses without granting credit toward graduation. Basic English language or mathematics courses are authorized only when the need for training has been established by accepted testing methods.

Refresher courses are courses that will permit the student to update knowledge and skills or be instructed in the technological advances that have occurred in the individual's field of employment during or after active duty.

Ch. 30, 32, 33 & 1607 participants: The student's entitlement will be charged for pursuit of these types of training.

Ch. 30 with Ch. 34 eligibility: Veterans are not charged entitlement for remedial and deficiency courses. However, in-service/active duty students are charged entitlement.

Ch. 35 Dependent/Spouses: Persons eligible under Chapter 35 are entitled to benefits for pursuit of remedial and deficiency courses without a charge to entitlement for the first five months of full-time pursuit of a program (or the equivalent in part-time educational assistance) consisting of such courses. **Refresher** training is not available to persons under Chapter 35.

Ch. 1606: Refresher, remedial and deficiency courses are payable. Entitlement is charged.

Sections 901 and 903: Benefits for refresher, remedial and deficiency courses are not payable for training under Section 901. Section 903 students may receive refresher training.

SUPPLEMENTAL ENROLLMENTS

Guest Student

A supplemental enrollment exists whenever a student's approved program of education involves training at more than one school. Students enrolling in courses through a supplemental (secondary) institution must first obtain approval in writing from the ERAU campus or Worldwide Online (AASA).

The supplemental school (secondary) must be approved by the DVA to participate in the education programs, and all courses must be required for completion of the student's Embry-Riddle degree. The supplemental school will certify the enrollment as a guest student and submit it to the DVA Regional Processing Office having jurisdiction for the primary ERAU location.

The DVA requires the university to have transcripts for supplemental enrollments no later than the second term (or 8 months whichever occurs first) following the term in which the course(s) is completed. If transcripts are not received, the university is required to notify the DVA. The DVA will terminate benefits effective the last date of enrollment. Once transcripts are received, certification of enrollment will resume.

Prior to registering at the supplemental Institution, students must obtain approval from his/her Academic Advisor verifying that ERAU will give full credit for the specific subjects taken at the supplemental school towards the students primary degree upon satisfactory completion.

Worldwide Online (AASA): students must forward approval information to the University Veterans' Affairs Office (UVAO). UVAO will send a parent letter to the supplemental institution authorizing them to certify the enrollment information to the Dept. of Veterans' Affairs.

EAGLEVISION

EagleVision is a web conferencing system that synchronously deliver courses to geographically separated students. This system is being used two ways:

- **EagleVision Classroom:** students attend class at an ERAU campus location and the EagleVision system is used to connect clusters of students gathered at these campuses. The instructor is at one of these campus locations typically with students and there is normally two to four remote locations.
- **EagleVision Home** students attend class virtually at home or office using their personal computer and internet connection. The EagleVision system is used to connect students to the instructor and other students.

VA classifies EagleVision Home as distance learning. The housing stipend is not paid for distance learning instruction.

TUITION ASSISTANCE AND VA TOP-UP

The military is authorized to pay up to 100% of the cost of tuition and other expenses charged by the school. If the military service department reimburses the service member for less than the 100% cost, VA education benefits can be paid for the remainder of the cost of that course not paid by the military. Students must contact the Education Service Office on base for processing information. Students must mail a copy of the Tuition Assistance Approval form to the DVA Regional Processing Office (RPO) with jurisdiction over their ERAU location. Educational institutions are **not permitted** to certify enrollments for students using the Top-Up option.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The major categories of financial assistance programs for undergraduates include loans, grants, scholarships and student employment. Loans from state and federal government sources or from private lenders must be repaid; however, the interest rate is usually low and the repayment period is extended. Grants and scholarships do not have to be repaid, nor does the income earned through student employment. Most of these programs are based on the financial need of the student.

DISABILITY SUPPORT SERVICES

ERAU is committed to the success of all students. It is a University policy to provide reasonable accommodations to the students with disabilities who qualify for services.
