## Stipend Award for Visiting

Prospective students who apply at the time of their campus visit receive a \$250 stipend award to be applied to their student account during their first semester of enrollment at Embry-Riddle. Interviews and tours are available Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and on Saturdays by appointment. To schedule your campus visit, contact the Office of International and Graduate Admissions. Admission seminars and staff visits to schools and universities overseas are scheduled throughout the year. Prospective students and applicants will be notified of opportunities to meet individually or in a group with a staff member. ## Financial Opportunities

### International Student Scholarships

Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University Student Scholarship consideration is given to all types of applicants, including freshmen, transfer, and graduate students who apply for admission. The scholarship decision is based on academic merit and demonstrated financial need.

**All International Students will be considered for academic Scholarships and Assistantships.**

### Children of Alumni Legacy Grant

An annual grant of U.S. \$1,500 is awarded to sons and daughters of Embry-Riddle alumni.

### On-Campus Employment

There are a limited number of on-campus jobs, which become available to all students on a competitive basis. Since on-campus jobs are not guaranteed, students should not include an on-campus job in their financial planning to cover the cost of attendance at the University.

### Alumni Endorsement Grant

Students enrolling in a full-time undergraduate program at Embry-Riddle are eligible for a U.S. \$1,000 grant, renewable annually for up to four years, when referred by an alum or trustee of the university. This endorsement **MUST** be submitted along with your completed application to the Office of International & Graduate Admissions on the Daytona Beach or Prescott campuses.

### Family Grant

A grant of U.S. \$2,200 is offered to each child of the same family simultaneously enrolled on a full-time basis.

### Payment Plan

Embry-Riddle offers a payment plan to qualified international students. If eligible, this program allows you an affordable alternative to pay for your annual expenses in equal installments. Upon arrival at the University, you may visit the Student Accounting Office for more information.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Applications are accepted up to one year prior to the intended entering semester. All applicants are encouraged to send applications and credentials as early as possible. Early applicants increase their chance of admission to competitive programs and can enhance the probability of locating a residence hall room.

### When will I receive an admissions decision?

After an application for international admission is received and complete with all required credentials and documents, an admission decision is usually sent within three weeks.

### How are international admissions decisions made?

Admission decisions are based on an applicant's academic credentials and proficiency in English. For an applicant who requires a student visa, the ability to finance his or her education at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University is also considered. If a student is academically admissible to a degree program, the admissions committee then determines how academically strong the student is compared to other applicants.

### Is the Scholastic Assessment Test or the American College Test required for freshman admission?

No, it is not required for international students; however, it is highly recommended that all freshman applicants take the examination. High scores will enhance the student's chance of admission. Also, an SAT or ACT score is considered for the Embry-Riddle Scholarship Program.

### Does the university require original documents?

All documents, including transcripts, letters of recommendation, test scores, and bank statements, must be originals or notarized copies. In addition, notarized or attested English translations of foreign transcripts are required. Facsimiles (fax) or photocopies are not acceptable.

### What happens once I am admitted?

You will need to complete and return a matriculation form and a U.S. \$200 tuition deposit by the reply date specified in your letter of admission. If for some reason you are denied a student visa, your \$200 will be refunded in full after requesting a refund in writing.

### Are there any special health issues for international students?

Before you leave home, make sure you have been immunized for measles, mumps, and rubella. Bring physician-certified copies of your immunization records with you and deliver them to the Office of Health Services when you arrive. The Health Services office will provide additional information once you have been admitted. International students are required to carry health insurance during their enrollment at Embry-Riddle. The University offers international student health coverage that covers most illnesses and injuries.

### What should I expect when I go to apply for my student visa?

In most cases the interview will be very brief. *There are three important points considered:*

- Do you have the academic background to prepare you for admission to the University? To demonstrate your academic ability,

bring your transcripts, results from the SAT or ACT, projected marks, recommendation letters from teachers, if possible, and your acceptance letter. All of these will help ensure that you are prepared.

- Are you able to pay the expenses of attending the University? It is advisable to have copies of the financial information you sent us, and any additional documentation that may prove you have the ability to pay for your education. If your parents are your sponsors, bringing information and documents about their financial positions may be helpful. Do you have definite plans to return home when you graduate from Embry-Riddle? Ways to help prove this may include documents that show that your family owns property or a business. It may be helpful to think of career opportunities you hope to develop in your home country with the degree you will be earning.
- Try to remain calm during the interview, and listen and respond carefully to the questions that the embassy official may ask. You may find that none of the above materials are necessary, but if asked, it is good to be able to supply them.

### I have an F-1 student visa and want to work on the campus. Is this permitted?

F-1 students holding a valid Embry-Riddle I-20 and enrolled in classes are eligible to work on the campus for up to 20 hours per week.

### SEVIS (Student and Exchange Visitor Information System)

Embry-Riddle is authorized under federal laws to enroll nonimmigrant alien students. An international applicant is defined as a nonresident, nonimmigrant person entering the United States on F-1 or J-1 student visas. All I-20's are issued through SEVIS, which is a governmental computerized system to maintain and manage data related to foreign students and exchange visitors during their stay in the United States. This system allows for real-time access to this information and assists students in complying with the terms of their visas. International students are required to comply with all SEVIS requirements.
